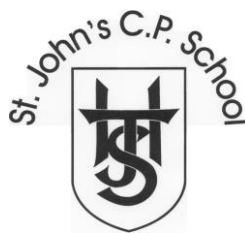

85 parents completed the survey online.

- 96% of parents say their child is happy at school, 99% say their child is safe at school. Ofsted said when inspected that 'safeguarding is outstanding'
- 90% of parents felt children behaved well in school with only 4% disagreeing. Visitors and staff and regularly report that behaviour of pupils is at least good within school

with attitudes towards learning being excellent and pupils being fully engaged in lessons.

- 15% of parents that responded felt they did not receive sufficient or valuable information about their child's progress. This is slightly better than last year but still an area to develop further. The following actions will be taken to address this:
 - A coffee morning will be held in September to allow parents to contribute suggestions about what they would like
 - Staff will explore further opportunities to share information about children
 - This will become a key aspect of school development for 2016/7 and will form part of the schools development plan.
 - A working party of parents will be consulted, as will pupils about any ideas for new ways to share information about progress.
 - We will talk to other schools.

Overall the Parent survey was incredibly positive however we are always looking for new ways to improve and welcome any feedback or suggestions. If you are unable to attend a coffee morning then please send an email or make an appointment via the school office and I will be happy to meet with you.
